The School particularly welcomes applications from candidates with research interests in the broad area of coaching and performance (e.g. coaching pedagogy; coach behaviour and practice-design; athlete learning and development; athlete welfare and wellbeing, coaching and sporting cultures), including Kaupapa Māori research and Mātauranga Māori.

The successful applicant will contribute to existing undergraduate papers in the Sport Development and Coaching major in the Bachelor of Health, Sport and Human Performance (BHSHP). They will also be expected to be involved in postgraduate teaching and supervision, and curriculum development.

Experience of applied practice and coach development is desirable, especially with Māori and Pacific communities. Applicants will be encouraged to forge links with relevant organisations/stakeholders and community groups within NZ and beyond. You will participate in the PBRF (government-sponsored) research funding exercise and be committed to attracting external research funding.
